2014 was the second year the Warren County Sheriff's Office teamed with Camp Joy to offer a free weekend police camp to 50 children.



School Resource Services

Deputy Kirk Nordbloom and Deputy Jonathan Downs are assigned as school resource deputies with the Sheriff's Office. Deputy Nordbloom is the School Resource Deputy assigned to the Warren County Career Center. Deputy Downs is the School Resource officer for the Kings Local School District.

Deputies Nordbloom and Downs were instrumental in 2014 ensuring the Warren County Career Center and the Kings Local School District operated in a smooth and safe fashion.

In addition to their daily duties as the School Resource Deputies, both offered many various safety presentations to students and staff members.

Training

The Warren County Sheriff's Office remains dedicated to training to the highest level of professionalism and safety for each and every member of the organization. During 2014 the training staff facilitated many different types of training sessions totaling **10,666** hours of training for members of the agency. Training sessions included county wide active shooter training, specialized training sessions, and various in-house training sessions.

In addition to training members of the organization, the training section was also instrumental in providing active shooter / intruder training (A.L.i.C.E.) to many school administrators, educators, and court staff members.

During 2014 the third annual Citizens Sheriff's Academy was held. This nine week Sheriff's Academy provided insight into the daily operation of the Sheriff's Office.

Conceal Carry License

During the year 2014 the Sheriff's Office continued to provide professional and efficient services processing Conceal Carry applications for new permits and renewals.

In 2014 the Sheriff's Office issued:

New Conceal Carry permits -1,407 a 181 % increase over those issued in 2013. Permit Renewals -1,707 a 210 % increase over those renewed in 2013. Replacement Permits -36

In order to accommodate the number of applicants, we've increased our number of appointments to 110 each week. (In 2014, we offered 75, in 2013 it was 31, and in 2012 it was only 21).
