School Resource Services

Deputy Kirk Nordbloom and Deputy Jonathan Downs are assigned as school resource deputies with the Sheriff's Office. Deputy Nordbloom is the School Resource Deputy assigned to the Warren County Career Center. Deputy Nordbloom was instrumental in 2013 ensuring the Career Center operated in a smooth and safe fashion.

In the fall of 2013, Deputy Downs began his duties as the School Resource Deputy for the Kings Local School District.

In addition to their daily duties as the School Resource Deputies, both offered many various safety presentations to students and staff members.

Training

The Warren County Sheriff's Office remains dedicated to training to the highest level of professionalism and safety for each and every member of the organization. During 2013 the training staff facilitated many different types of training sessions totaling **10,578** hours of training for members of the agency. Training sessions included county wide active shooter training, specialized training sessions, and various in-house training sessions.

In addition to training members of the organization, the training section was also instrumental in providing active shooter / intruder training (A.L.i.C.E.) to many school administrators, educators, and court staff members.

During 2013 the second annual Citizens Sheriff's Academy was held. This nine week Sheriff's Academy provided insight into the daily operation of the Sheriff's Office.
